SPOKANE AQUIFER JOINT BOARD MEETING MINUTES

(1) CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME:

The Board of Directors of the Spokane Aquifer Joint Board (SAJB) met in Regular Session at Vera Water and Power, 601 N. Evergreen, Spokane, Washington on August 22, 2002. President Ty Wick welcomed those in attendance and called the meeting to order at 1:45PM.

Board of Directors Roll Call and Introductions:

President Ty Wick, Vice-President Bob Ashcraft, Treasurer Steve Skipworth and Secretary Kathleen Small were in attendance. A total of 12 attended the meeting, 10 SAJB member representatives, Program Leader (PL) Julia McHugh and Bill Rickard, City of Spokane, as per the attached Meeting Attendance Register. Secretary Small took the minutes of the meeting.

Consideration of the July 25, 2002 Meeting Minutes:

The minutes of the SAJB meeting held on July 25, 2002 were approved as sent out.

(2) FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

SAJB Administration Funds:

Treasurer Skipworth reported as follows: The SAJB Checking account balance is \$3,191.34 and the Spokane County Investment Pool (Wellhead Protection) balance is \$1,050.78. Treasurer Skipworth said 20 members have paid their dues.

SAJB Wellhead Implementation Plan (WIP) Funds: Ty Wick for Kim Beal, City of Spokane reported the WIP checking account balance is \$21,316.52, the Spokane County Investment Pool (Implementation) is \$232,284.87 and Implementation Savings is \$1,065.58.

Presented/Approved Administration and WIP Bills:

President Wick presented the attached Bill Payment Summary (Total of \$ 5,277.64) for August 2002. Those present reviewed the summary. Bob Ashcraft made the motion, and Lynn Plaggemeier seconded, that the bills be paid in accordance with the presented summary as follows: Wellhead Implementation bills: \$5,269.87, which includes the Program Leader Fee, plus Mileage and Reimbursable in the amount of \$5,155.87 for 7/24/02 through 8/20/02. Administration Bills: \$7.77. President Wick called for the vote, the motion carried unanimously.

Agua Duck Contract

Three new applicants were interviewed by the Education and Awareness Committee and the Committee recommends that we accept this group of students as a replacement for the previous vendor. Resolution 2002-04 was amended to indicate Jason Thayer, Steven J. Barry and Scott Doughty as the replacement for Patrick Treadway and obligating them to perform the contract for development of the Aqua-Duck character and increasing the budget \$500.00 for contingencies. Motion by Dave Johnson, seconded by Bob Ashcraft, and unanimously passed.

SAJB Committee Participation by SAJB Members

President Wick appointed a committee to recommend minimum levels of participation in SAJB activities by SAJB members. A number of SAJB members have not attended monthly meetings and/or committee meetings for a substantial period of time. This places the burden of carrying out the Wellhead Implementation efforts on the few who routinely participate. The committee consists of Bob Ashcraft, Lynn Plaggemeier, Dave Johnson and Julia McHugh.

First reading – Education and Awareness Committee.

Inspection of Water Service Lines between property line and building

Steve Skipworth reported that normally the water purveyor is responsible from the water main to the property line for the water service line. However, a "No man's land" exists on service lines from the property line to the building or point of use as the County inspects the water service line within the building only. Steve talked to Spokane County and encouraged them to also cover that portion of the water service line installed on the property. He will follow this issue and may need additional support from other purveyors to convince the County that they should take responsibility for all of the water service line located on the customer's property.
