Guest speaker for November meeting – Ms. Michelle Vasquez, Department of Health, Drinking Water Division – overview of HB 1338 (water conservation legislation)

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Board of Directors of the Spokane Aquifer Joint Board (SAJB) met in Regular Session at Vera Water and Power, 601 S. Evergreen Road, Spokane, Washington on September 18, 2003. President Wick welcomed those in attendance and noted that a quorum was not present. Consequently a regular meeting was not possible, however the meeting continued as an informational session only.

Board of Directors Roll Call and Introductions

President Ty Wick, Treasurer Steve Skipworth and Secretary Kathleen Small were in attendance. A total of 9 attended the meeting, 8 SAJB member representatives (representing 9 SAJB entities) and Program Leader Julia McHugh.

2. FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

SAJB Administration Funds

Treasurer Steve Skipworth reported as follows: The SAJB Checking Account balance is \$2,768.43 (includes 8 dues payments) and the Spokane County Investment Pool (Wellhead Protection) balance is \$1,082.14.

SAJB Wellhead Implementation Plan (WIP) Funds

President Wick reported as follows: The WIP checking balance is \$17,250.55, the Spokane County Investment Pool (Implementation) is \$87,975.31 and Implementation Savings is \$72.78.

Presented/Approved Administration and WIP Bills

President Wick stated the bill payment summaries for July, August and September would be presented at the October 23, 2003 meeting.

3. OLD BUSINESS

Letter to Model Irrigation District

President Wick provided those present with a copy of the letter dated September 15, 2003 sent to Model Irrigation outlining SAJB accomplishments.

Election of Officers: Tabled until the October 23, 2003 meeting.

Aguifer Quantity Study (AQS)

President Wick reported the funding request for the AQS by Washington, Idaho and the U. S. Geological Survey is now at \$500,000 and has been approved by the Senate and House and may be signed by the President by October 1st.

4. NEW BUSINESS

Annual Assessment for Wellhead Implementation Plan

Those present discussed the annual assessment, which is \$ 0.12 per connection as of January 1, 2003, noting the membership elected not to assesses the first half. Those present agreed that the second half assessment appeared to be necessary and President Wick will have invoices prepared for review and approval at the October 23, 2003 meeting.
