SPOKANE AQUIFER JOINT BOARD MEETING MINUTES

(1) CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME:

The Board of Directors of the Spokane Aquifer Joint Board (SAJB) met in Regular Session at Vera Water and Power, 601 N. Evergreen, Spokane, Washington on September 26, 2002. Vice President Bob Ashcraft welcomed those in attendance and called the meeting to order at 1:40PM. Self-introductions were given. President Ty Wick arrived late and assumed control of the meeting from the Vice President.

Board of Directors Roll Call and Introductions:

President Ty Wick, Vice-President Bob Ashcraft, Treasurer Steve Skipworth and Secretary Kathleen Small were in attendance. A total of 21 attended the meeting, 15 SAJB member representatives, Program Leader (PL) Julia McHugh and Kim Beal, City of Spokane, and 4 guests as per the attached Meeting Attendance Register. Secretary Small took the minutes of the meeting.

Consideration of the August 22, 2002 Meeting Minutes:

The minutes of the SAJB meeting held on August 22, 2002 were approved as sent out.

(2) FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

SAJB Administration Funds:

Treasurer Skipworth reported as follows: The SAJB Checking account balance is \$6,333.57 and the Spokane County Investment Pool (Wellhead Protection) balance is \$1,053.67. Treasurer Skipworth said that all but one member has paid their dues, he anticipated that our insurance bill will be due soon.

SAJB Wellhead Implementation Plan (WIP) Funds: Kim Beal, City of Spokane reported the WIP checking account balance is \$16,046.65, the Spokane County Investment Pool (Implementation) is \$233,064.36 and Implementation Savings is \$1,066.26.

Presented/Approved Administration and WIP Bills:

President Wick presented the attached Bill Payment Summary (Total of \$ 19,207.59) for September 2002. Those present reviewed the summary. Walt McKee made the motion, and Gary Lowe seconded, that the bills be paid in accordance with the presented summary as follows: Wellhead Implementation bills: \$4,142.59, which includes the Program Leader Fee, plus Mileage and Reimbursable in the amount of \$4,142.79 for 8/21/02 through 9/24/02. \$25,000 will be transferred from SCIP to Checking. President Wick called for the vote, the motion carried unanimously.

(3) OLD BUSINESS:

Aquifer Quantity Study by Spokane/Coeur d'Alene Areas Chambers of Commerce

Those that attended the meeting reported that the Congressional Review Committee, the States and USGS are still trying to work out who will be in charge of the study.

SAJB Committee Participation by SAJB Members

Bob Ashcraft reported that the committee met and decided to contact the organizations that have been absent and let them know that their attendance and input is important to this group. Today's attendance was greatly improved from past meetings.

Robinson Research Survey

The survey was passed out in CD form. The comparison between the two surveys is still in process.

Resolution 2002-05

A second reading of Resolution 2002-05 authorizing a contract for completion of a virtual "tour" utilizing Internet sites was conducted. A Motion to accept this resolution and proceed was made by Bob Ashcraft, seconded by Walt McKee and unanimously passed.

4) NEW BUSINESS:

Pasadena Park Irrigation District Well #1

PPID #17 is working with West Valley School District to include their hand dug and brick lined Well #1 site as part of their "Learning Center" which is located across the street next to Pasadena Park Elementary School. K. Small would like to know if the SAJB would be interested in helping make a financial contribution to support this effort. President Wick assigned this question to the Education & Awareness Committee for their review and recommendation to the SAJB Board for future action. If you have any questions, please contact K. (5) WELLHEAD PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION PLAN Committee Reports

<u>ProActive Business</u> – Ecology interns have visited 62 sites (Auto Body Shops and Dentists) in July and August. They will continue the visits, however, because of an increase in their workload, the number of visits is expected to decrease in succeeding months.

<u>Potential Contaminant Source Inventory</u> – Map revisions by the end of September, risk ranking to be done by subcommittee prior to completion.

<u>Household Contaminant Disposal</u> – waiting on data from Regional Solid Waste to determine if increase in contaminants turned in as a result of HCD event (computer crash has hampered the tally).

<u>Education & Awareness</u> – Water Week event on Saturday, September 28, 10 am-4 pm Barker Road and Centennial Trail. Background checks are complete on all actors, so the Aqua Duck will debut at this event.

Emergency Planning – Water Quality Emergency Coordination questionnaire will be collected by the end of October.
