SPOKANE AQUIFER JOINT BOARD MEETING MINUTES

November 17, 2005

1) CALL TO ORDER

The Board of Directors of the Spokane Aquifer Joint Board (SAJB) met in Regular Session at Pasadena Park Irrigation District No. 17, 9227 E. Upriver Drive, Spokane, Washington on November 17, 2005. President Wick welcomed those in attendance and called the meeting to order at 1:45 PM.

Board of Directors Roll Call and Introductions

President Ty Wick, Treasurer Steve Skipworth and Secretary Kathleen Small were in attendance. Vice President Bob Ashcraft was absent. A total of 17 attended the meeting, 9 SAJB Representatives voting for 11 SAJB Entities, 1 Non-Voting SAJB Representative, Program Leader Julia McHugh and 6 Guests.

Consideration of Regular Meeting Minutes

President Wick called for any additions, corrections or comments on the Minutes of October 26, 2005. The Minutes of October 26, 2005 were approved as presented.

2) FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

SAJB Administration Funds

Treasurer Steve Skipworth reported as follows: The SAJB Checking Account balance is \$3,419.17 and the Spokane County Investment Pool (Wellhead Protection) balance is \$1,188.00. Treasurer Skipworth noted Kaiser Trentwood has not paid their dues.

SAJB Wellhead Implementation Plan (WIP) Funds

Mary McIntyre, City of Spokane Accountant, reported as follows: The WIP checking balance is \$ 12,448.04, the Spokane County Investment Pool (Implementation) is \$ 126,384.83 and Implementation Savings is \$73.38.

Presented/Approved Administration and WIP Bills

President Wick presented the attached Bill Payment Summary for November 2005 - Total \$ 5,928.82. Those present reviewed the summary, discussion followed. Walt McKee made the motion, and Dave Johnson seconded, that the bills be paid accordance with the presented November 2005 Summary. The Summary detailed Wellhead Administration – 0 - and Wellhead Implementation Bills of \$5,928.82 including the Program Leader Fee, plus mileage and reimbursement, total \$ 5,703.82 for the period 10/26/05 through 11/16/05. President Wick called for the vote, the motion passed unanimously.

- 1) Underground Injection Control (UIC) Program Draft Rule Workshop reminder the meeting is Friday November 18th, Spokane Falls Community College, W. 3410 Ft. Geo. Wright Dr., Student Union Bldg, Lounge AB, 2:30 4:30 p.m. "The purpose of the UIC Program rules is to protect ground water by regulating the discharges to UIC wells."
- 2) Reminder: all of the public comments received by Ecology on the preliminary draft Eastern Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permit are now available on Ecology's website. Ecology is in the process of reviewing and considering all of the comments received and will notify everyone when a formal draft permit ready for public comment. Hearing @ City of Spokane Valley did not take place, settlement negotiation in process; Irvin attorney has proposed additional mitigation, waiting for reply

- 5) ID/WA Aquifer study Policy Advisory Committee meeting Nov 14th to plan the next public update meeting to be held in January 2006; providing a venue for outside groups (Sierra Club, Lands Council etc.) will be discussed
