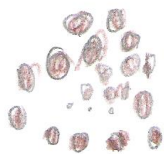
Thank you so much for taking your valuable time, money and effort to teach us all of those incredibly interesting facts about an Aquifer.

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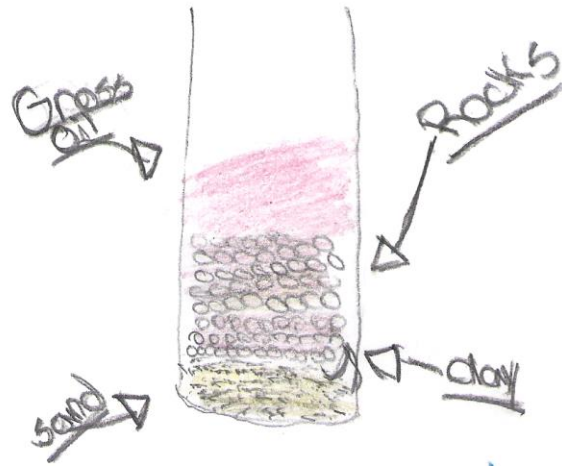
Dear Ms. Zimmer,
