- 7. Announce the first annual award at the 2022 SRF Conference.





Split between Spokane County and SAJB Each paying \$3,088.00


10,000 folders lasted SAJB 5 years

- 4/9/21 Edits from open comment period reviewed.
- 4/15/21 Final SWMP sent to Ecology

For businesses that completed the Pollution Prevention Visit with SRHD we are scheduling certification visits via Zoom.


