1. Elizabeth Lancaster is planning to have workshops during KSPS's weekly after-school programs taught KSPS Staff each week at 5 high-needs elementary schools (Logan, Whitman, Stevens, Lidgerwood, and Grant).
2. Add aquifer workshops to KSPS summer camps.
3. Capitalize on Elizabeth's artistic education abilities: KSPS will look for an opportunity to have young kids paint an aquifer-related mural this summer. Ideally, it would be a location in NE or SE Spokane and engage kids from the schools with which KSPS currently works.
4. Also being considered is including aquifer experiences in a summer program being developed for middle and high school students from Rogers, Shaw, or Garry.

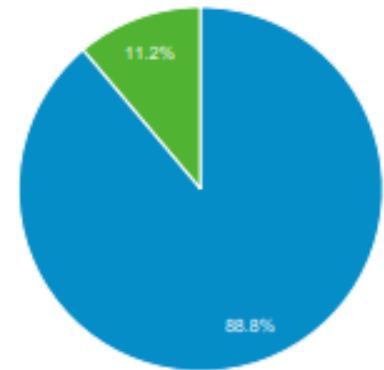

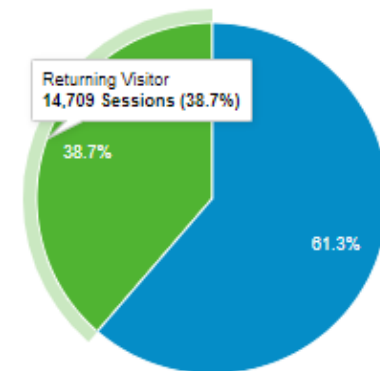

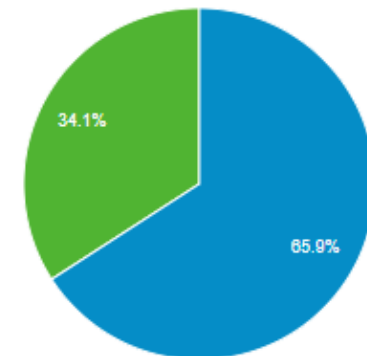
